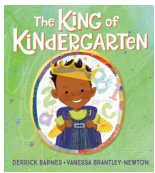

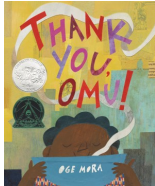
Picture books, Easy Readers, and Non-Fiction books for emerging readers entering or in Kindergarten.

by Derrick Barnes

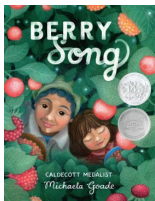
An empowering story about a confident kid who takes pride in his first day of kindergarten, uplifting his new classmates.

by Julie Flett

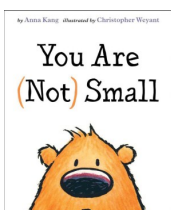
A joyous book about playtime for babies, toddlers, and kids of all ages!

by Mo Willems

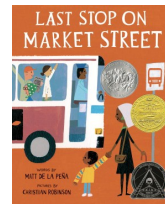
Pigeon has just learned that he has to start attending school. Surely not! After all, he already knows everything.

by Anna Kang

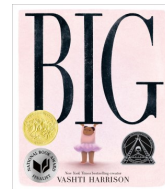
this amusing book about size comparison also offers a clever introduction to perspective-taking.

by Vashti Harrison

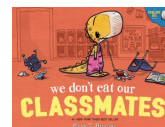
This emotional exploration of being big in a world that prizes small is a tender portrayal of how you can stand out and feel invisible at the same time.

Celebrate a school where diversity, songs, stories, and talents are shared.

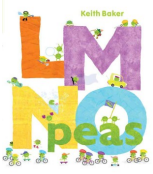


## Danbi Leads the School Parade

An uplifting tribute to 100 everyday things worth celebrating, listed in rhyming couplets that depict a preschooler's everyday world, highlights pleasures that

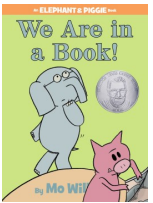
range from slippery floors and dinosaurs to goldfish and a birthday wish.

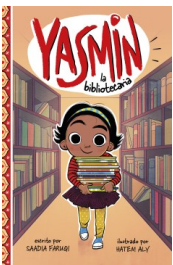
Illustrations and brief text introduce colors and the concepts of shape and size

by Mo Willems

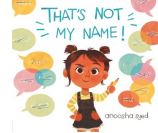
When Piggie discovers that she and Gerald are in a book and she can make the reader say a funny word out loud, Gerald is tickled pink, but what happens when the story is over?

by Saadia Faruqi

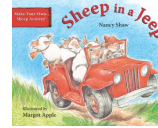
It's library day, and Yasmin is the helper! She loves shelving books, but suddenly, Yasmin discovers that her own special book is missing. How will she find it among all the other books?

by Anoosha Syed

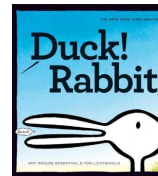

by Nancy Shaw

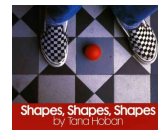

Photographs of familiar objects such as chair, barrettes, and manhole cover present a study of rounded and angular

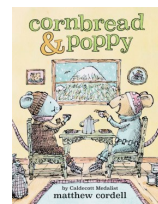

by Tana Hoban

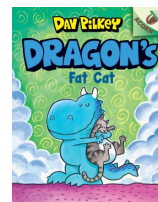
Through full-color photographs in a die-cut format, this creative concept book allows young readers an opportunity to study and explore the things they see and to stimulate their imaginations and observation skills.
